

About Summerlee

In 1986, Summerlee Presbyterian Church supported the group of valley churches who served in West Virginia. Summerlee Presbyterian had a liaison from the church that made contacts and set up jobs for the annual mission trip. The church had the group over for a fish fry in the earlier years as well. After a few years of churches from the valley serving together, people thought this mission trip should be named, so it became known as the Summerlee Mission Trip after Summerlee Presbyterian Church.

Since 1986, Valley churches have been serving together in West Virginia. A scouting group will now travel over to Fayette County in the Spring to designate work sites for the upcoming summer mission trip. All year long, congregations prepare for Summerlee through annual fundraisers, sharing stories and preparing their heart to serve.

The Annual Summerlee Dinner is held on the first Friday of December at Mt. Horeb Presbyterian Church in Grottos at 6 pm. This gathering is to share mission stories from the previous year and plan for the upcoming mission trip.


JOIN WORK CREW, PAINT CREW, KITCHEN CREW, TRASH CREW or KID CREW

KID CREW- Kids under the age of 12 now have an option to serve on the KID CREW. Throughout the week, the KID CREW serves in the morning at a variety of missions such as stocking a food pantry, sharing crafts with mentally challenged adults, singing songs in nursing homes, and learning about coal miners in W.V. At noon, the KID CREW eats lunch at a work site where parents are working on homes. In the afternoon, the KID CREW enjoys time at the pool, lake and if a rainy day occurs, bowling. HOUSING OPTIONS

Families, church groups and individuals book their own housing for cabins, RV parking or camping. Please contact Curtis Foltz at 540-943-3870 for help setting up your housing. The phone number for campground reservations is 304-574-1802 and the website to view cabins is www.fayettevillewvlodging.com. Be sure to mention Summerlee when making reservation.



CABINS include small Amish ones pictured above that have 1 bunk that sleeps 2 or 3 people (bottom bunk is double) & a loft that sleeps 3 people. The Amish cabins also have a/c, coffee pot, microwave, & shower for approx. \$80 per night. Larger cabins are available, such as the Greenbriar that houses 14 for \$225 per night.

The cost of parking an RV or camper on a site is \$30 per night

Quality Inn Motel in Fayetteville, WV is \$65.00 per room/per night. 1-800-992-2694

The motel is located across the street from the campground. (A block of rooms is usually reserved at a good rate.)
